Terry McDonald, For the past 21 years of operation, The Power House Youth Center has welcomed over 5,400 teens to their programming. This organization is open to all teens regardless of faith. Their goal is to provide a safe place for students to grow, heal, and become well-grounded and well-rounded young adults. The Power House

Youth Center focuses on 5 key components: (1) Showing the Love of Christ, (2) Sharing and Expressing Family Values, (3) Teaching about Healthy Lifestyles, (4) Promoting Abstinence & STD Awareness, (5) Providing Alcohol, Tobacco, and Drug Awareness and Prevention. The Center has seen many lives transformed through this program.

VOLUNTEERS & MENTORS NEEDED (How You Can Get Involved)

A vital part of the mission at The Power House is to give the youth of our community a safe, drug-free environment surrounded by caring Christian adults. There are many different ways you can get involved and volunteer:

<u>Power Plant</u> - This after school program runs Monday-Thursday from 3:00-6:00 p.m. It offers teens an opportunity to hang out, build relationships, learn life skills and enjoy free snacks and games. Homework help is also available to all members during this time. Adults can volunteer one afternoon a week or once every other week.

<u>Fuse</u> - The Center is open every Friday from 7:00-11:00 p.m. during the school year. It's a positive "club" type of environment where teens can go to have a great time with friends in a safe place. This program includes fun competitions, video games, pool tables, uplifting music and a lot of room to just hang out with friends. The Power House strives to have at least 10-14 volunteers each Friday night and they are looking for adults who can volunteer at least one Friday night a month.

<u>GAP</u> - This program runs Friday night from 5:00-6:45 p.m. A meal is provided for students who come to the Center. This provides an opportunity for program volunteers to sit down with students in a "family" style setting and share a meal together. GAP also offers a time of worship, teaching, and an opportunity for small break out groups so that volunteers can interact with students on a personal level.

<u>Mentor</u> - You can influence the life of a young man or young lady who desperately needs a role model by volunteering just one hour a week of your time to the program.

Provide Snacks - Students can come in for an afternoon snack daily from 3:00-6:00 p.m.

Be a Tutor - From time to time, students need additional help with homework. The students of the Power House love to have caring adults come in and spend time with them. Just think of the impact that you could have on the life of a young person. By giving back, your life will be impacted as well!



2017 Leaf Pick Up Schedule



Leaves should be ready on the first pick up day of the week that crews are scheduled to be in your part of the city. Leaves must be raked onto the park strip between the sidewalk and curb (NOT IN THE STREET), and away from street signs, poles, mailboxes and parked cars. Long rows are preferred over one big pile. All leaves will be picked up as close to the published schedule as possible.
